## Financial Report:

The chart provided below is reflective of the sales and expenses as recorded to date on 12-29-17. An updated chart will be provided prior to the Board Meeting on January $4^{\text {th }}$. Mother Nature has given us a run for our money over the past four weeks. We have been able to keep the Porcupine Chair running through the warm weather which has allowed us to keep the core staff working. The daily ticket sales are down significantly as a result of only being able to sell Porcupine only tickets for $\$ 15$. We have hopes of being able to get at least Hooter open by the middle of week which should create a nice spike in revenue. Despite the warm weather we are still seeing a couple of Seasons Pass sales trickle in which shows that the consumers still have good confidence that we will have a good season ahead. ## Mountain Operations:

Our snowpack took a big hit during the record warm spell in the early part of December that broke the 75 year old record for high temperatures. The Mountain Operations crew was able to manage the manmade snow that we had laid down in November allowing us to keep the Porcupine Lift open throughout the warm weather. By the time the temperatures turned around the snow cover was getting pretty thin. We were able to start back into Snowmaking operations on December $18^{\text {th }}$ to refortify the porcupine area to ensure that there would be enough trail space to have room for the Holiday Camp Lesson Program, single day lessons and the Juneau Ski Club's Race Team all on the hill together. By Thursday the $28^{\text {th }}$ we were able to add Stickleback into the mix and were able to move snowguns back over to Hooter on Wednesday the $27^{\text {th }}$ and started blowing below the road on Sourdough and down to the bottom of Ptarmigan and Hooter with the goal of running until the night of Sunday the 31st. Holiday Lesson Camps were very successful with all of the kids progressing in their abilities and able to ride the Porcupine Chair by the end of the three day program.

It is looking like we are instore for a change in the weather on New Year's day into a more active cycle with numerous waves of precipitation moving through. We have hopes of opening Hooter back up by Tuesday morning and to finish the School Holiday Break with a very busy finish by adding in more of the upper mountain terrain. More updates to come during our Board Meeting as the temperature range and intensity of the weeks weather is uncertain in many of the forecast models.
